Dear Parents

I hope that you were all able to enjoy some quality family time and to rest and relax during the holidays and that your children have had a fun first day at school.

A warm word of welcome to our new families. Whilst you have been away our facilities team have been hard at work on a number of projects. The auditorium has been completely refurbished with a new stage, seating, sound and lighting. It looks superb and the acoustics are terrific. The main sportsfield has been resurfaced and the gymnasium, too, has been refurbished with a new surface, top quality basketball hoops, acoustic panels and plenty of new equipment. The kindergarten playground has new equipment, sandpit and play surface. Indoors, a paint team has been sprucing up the classrooms and corridors.

Our teaching staff has been back for several weeks, planning and preparing. We have some strong additions to both our leadership team and teaching staff and I am confident that they will make a significant input into the process of taking our school from good to outstanding. You will hear the phrase 'CAR' a good deal this year. We will ask ourselves, 'is your car still on the road? Is your car lost or run out of petrol?'


















Welcome to the Secondary School
